



Aloha Parent or Guardian:

This year your keiki's school: Farrington High School will be partnering with Project Vision Hawai'i to perform vision screenings. **These services will be provided at Farrington High School at no cost to you.**

Quality vision care is an important component of education; students that cannot see often struggle to learn to read, to see the board, and to succeed academically.

**All students at Farrington High School will be offered a free vision screening during school time on the dates of March 28<sup>th</sup>-April 3<sup>rd</sup> 2019.** If your student does not pass the vision screening your child will be sent home with a referral letter and a permission slip for the child to receive a free vision exam courtesy of Vision to Learn, Project Vision Hawai'i, and a local eye doctor. A licensed Vision to Learn Optometrist to perform a basic eye exam on the student, and will prescribe glasses if appropriate. You will be informed if your child may need follow-up care.

The eye exam and eyeglasses are available to all students who need them, at no out-of-pocket cost to parents or children.

If you want your child to participate in the vision screening, no action is required.
